


Regional Background

- Neighboring towns: Harvard, Shirley, Lancaster and Ayer
- Boston market influence still exists in this area
- Excellent transportation access including Heavy Rail and Commuter Rail



Planning for Redevelopment

- Job loss and economic re-development
- •1993 BSA Planning Charette with Surrounding Towns
- Remediation, monitoring
- Strong emphasis on cleaning up the site and ensuring environmentally responsible redevelopment
- Focus on industrial ecology as a strategy mimic ecological processes (system of industries)





Industrial ecology: one companies waste product becomes another's raw material

Devens Reuse Plan

1994 Reuse Plan

- Focus on economic revitalization
- Created large industrial/R&D districts
- Emphasis on open space,
 conservation and sustainability
- Provided for up to 282 housing units (the "cap")
- Basis for Devens Bylaws
- Approved by towns and MD





1994: Devens By-Laws

- Zoning Allowed/Prohibited uses
- Density
- dimensional requirements
- floodplain
- groundwater resource protection
- historic district
- Signage
- wetland and watercourse protection provisions.



MassDevelopment:

- Massachusetts Land Bank Massachusetts Development Finance Agency (MDFA or MassDevelopment);
- Broad powers to finance and undertake ED statewide;
- Legislature \$200M in bonding capacity for Devens redevelopment (admin.by MD);
- Full-time staff at Devens (real estate, engineering, public works, utilities, FD, operations).

Planning Board → Site Plan Review

Zoning Board → Variances

Conservation Commission → Wetland Order of Conditions

Historic District Commission \rightarrow Coordinate with MHC

Board of Health → Facility Siting Permits, Food Service

Building Inspection → Building, plumbing, gas, electric

Liquor licenses → 6 liquor licenses


Development Review
